

LCUAA Celebrate Student Athlete Excellence at TCGC





MINDANAO’S LONGEST BRIDGE

Dubbed as Mindanao's longest sea-crossing bridge, the P7.38-billion priority infrastructure project is funded through a loan from the Korean Export Import Bank.

The bridge crosses Panguil Bay in the Northern Mindanao Region in southern Philippines. Connecting Lanao del Norte’s capital Tubod and Tangub City in Misamis Occidental, the bridge will cut travel time to under 10 minutes from the current two to 2.5 hours through a 100-kilometer route or via a roll-on, roll-off vessel.



This mega bridge project was greenlighted back in 2017. Once completed it will surpassed the San Juanico Bridge (2.16 km).

The project is scheduled to be completed by December 2023 under a contract with the Korean firm Namkwang-Kukdong-Gumgwa-ng Joint Venture. ##

On Friday, August 26, 2023, the Electrical Department of the Asenso Tangub Administration revealed that a total of 240 households have been provided with electricity as part of the LGU's electrification program.

It is known that out of the 328 households scheduled for electrical line installation, 240 have already been electrified by the personnel from the Electrical Department.

The following barangays have benefited from this program in the past month: Barangay Aquino with 18 households electrified, Barangay Manga with 1 household, San Apo with 8 households, Matugnaw with 10 households, Prenza with 10 households, Kauswagan with 8 households, Maquilao with 3 households, Isidro D. Tan with 4 households, Caniangan

with 14 households, Simasay with 7 households, Mantic with 2 households, Paiton with 7 households, Bintana with 6 households, Silangit with 9 households, Guilanaban with an additional 5 households, Pangabuan with 12 households, Labuyo with 1 household, and Lorenzo Tan with 10 households, among others.

Meanwhile, some barangays, such as San Vicente, Guinalaban, Garang, Pangabuan, Caniangan, and Balatacan, have just begun receiving electricity service, with a total of 6, 6, 12, 1, 3, and 5 households respectively.

The Electrification Program under the Asenso Tangub Administration is an ongoing effort to provide free electricity to all households without access to it. ##

Stall Occupants in Mall 3 and Mall 4 Attend Meeting at CEEDO Office

In the afternoon of August 24, 2023, a meeting was held at the CEEDO (City Economic Enterprise Development Office) office at 2:00 PM, where 48 vendors from Mall 3 and Mall 4 gathered to discuss important matters.

The vendors included those from various sections, including those in Painitan (food stalls), Dry goods, Shoe repair, Tailoring, Manicure services, Banana cue stalls, Bairan (liquor stalls), and Tabacoan (tobacco stalls).

The meeting was chaired by Mr. Reuby Enguito, the Head of CEEDO, and attended by key personnel, including Mr. Boy Tala from the Market Committee, Mr. Zaro Cuizon, the Public Mall Coordinator, Mr. Mulong Kaamiño, a CEEDO staff member, and Mr. Andres Sarona.

Mr. Enguito explained the role of CEEDO in managing and operating various economic enterprises in the city, such as the



Market, Public Malls 1, 2, 3, and 4, Wet Market, Slaughterhouse, Market Bus Terminal, Water System, Housing Development program, and other economic ventures. CEEDO's primary objective is to ensure the efficient management of these businesses.

The main purpose of the gathering was to inform all vendors about the upcoming launch of Public Mall 3 and 4, which was at the end of September or in October. It was emphasized that the construction of these malls will not be done in batches but as a whole to avoid disruptions in the market. Gov. Henry S. Oaminal has allocated 40 million pesos for this project to ensure the smooth transition.

Vendors were also informed about the temporary relocation arrangements during the construction of Mall 3 and 4. They will temporarily operate their businesses from the new building of Mall 2, adjacent to the Painitan area. The temporary relocation will be properly fenced off.

Additionally, vendors were briefed on the limited number of stalls available in the temporary relocation area to avoid overcrowding. Procedures for selecting occupants and obtaining business permits were discussed thoroughly.

Priority will be given to existing occupants in the old infrastructure, ensuring their continuity in the new location. The re-vamping of the old market's appearance has been a long-time plan, spanning over 40 years, and it will finally be realized within a year under the new administration's commitment to making Misamis more peaceful, prosperous, and happy.

The meeting addressed the concerns and ensure a smooth transition for all stakeholders involved in the redevelopment of the market. ##

Tangub City, September 19, 2023 - Several departments or offices of the LGU conducted community service on September 19, 2023, both in the morning and afternoon.





he "Kasalan Ng Bayan" program,
a brainchild of Mayor Ben Canama, Vice
Mayor Tito Decina, and the city councilors,
offers couples who have long been togeth-
er, with children, but haven't formalized
their union the chance to get married.

Councilor Alexander Retuerto,
chair of the Social Services Committee,
oversees the "Kasalan Ng Bayan," part of
Asenso Tangub Administration's broader
efforts to strengthen family bonds and en-
courage lasting partnerships among Tan-
gubanon.

The recent Kasalan ng Bayan, held on Au-
gust 9, 2023, is the latest in a series of mass
weddings initiated by the local govern-
ment. The first Kasalan ng Bayan was Sep-
tember 16 and 17, 2022, with 79 couples
getting married. Subsequent ceremonies
were held on December 19 and 20, 2022,
where 83 couples exchanged vows, fol-
lowed by another on February 16 and 17,
2023, with 57 couples. The fourth Kasalan
ng Bayan took place on April 13 and 14,
2023, with 77 couples participating. The
most recent one, on June 28, 2023, saw 42
couples uniting in matrimony. All of these
events were conducted at the People's
Gymnasium, with Mayor Ben Canama offi-
ciating the ceremonies.

Each couple that participated in
the "Kasalan Ng Bayan" program had a
budget of 20,000 pesos, covering expenses
such as food, decorations, and more. The
local government of Tangub City allocated
a total of 6,670,000 pesos for these five
town weddings.

The success of these mass wed-
dings has prompted the local government
to plan for more similar events in the fu-
ture, aiming to continue strengthening
family bonds and promoting love and unity
within the community. ##

Over 713,900 Pesos in Cash Assistance Released in August

In a recent update from the Assistance for Individuals in Crisis Situation (AICS) personnel, it has been revealed that cash assistance amounting to over 713,900 pesos was disbursed in just two weeks during the month of August. This information was reported on the afternoon of Friday, August 18, 2023.

From August 2 to August 14 of this month, a total of 174 Tangubanon residents received much-needed cash assistance through the AICS program.

On August 2, 18 individuals received assistance, totaling 105,400 pesos. The following day, August 3, saw 7 more beneficiaries receiving a total of 22,000 pesos in assistance. On August 4, AICS disbursed 45,000 pesos to 11 Tangubanon residents seeking aid.

Moving forward to August 11, another 20 individuals received cash assistance amounting to 72,500 pesos. August 10 marked the release of 349,500 pesos to 77 individuals. Finally, on August 14, an additional 41 Tangubanon residents received close assistance totaling 119,500 pesos from AICS.
