Tangub Launches RCSP Tangub City Celebrates Fiesta under the New Normal



Tangub City, through the Dept. of Interior and Local Government as the lead agency, launched the Retooled Community Service Program (RCSP) last Sept 4, 2020 at Function Hall 1. This is the enhancement of the previous Community Service Program to end hostilities in conflict affected barangays of the country, but with military solution. Deeply rooted issues such as poverty, historical injustice, social inequality and others need a more comprehensive and multi sectoral solution or convergence of efforts. This is the essence of the newly signed Executive Order 70 which embodies the Whole-of-Nation Approach.

City Mayor Jennifer Tan, the city officials, heads of local and national agencies, and men in uniform from the Philippine Army, Police, Fire Department, Bureau of Jail Management and Penology,

Coast Guard and other stake holders attended the launching.

Various phases are involved in the program implementation. Phase One is the organization of the RCSP team and core team. In Phase Two, governance gaps and needed development are identified. The barangay folks identify their needs and problems during the community immersion. From these identified needs and problems, Phase Four comes in as sustaining the empowerment of the local government unit and the communities.

Mayor Tan appreciated the program and stressed that this will be extended to the rest of the 51 barangays.

"Let's not wait for a barangay to be affected by conflict before we implement this approach.

So far, the program has taken off and well into the preparation for "Serbisyo Caravan."

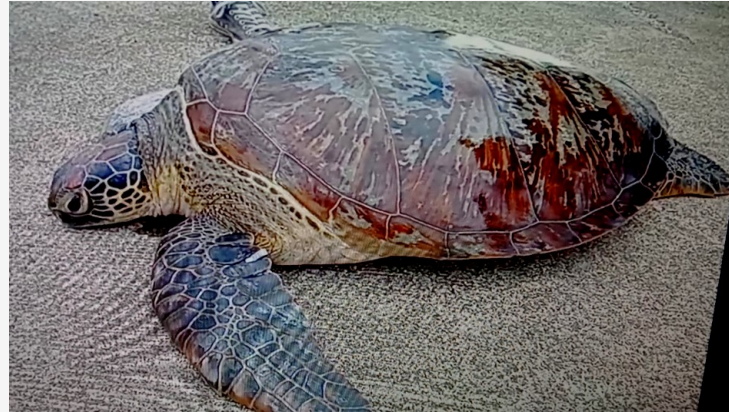

occupying 3,342 has. or 6% of the total forest/timber area (33,117 has) inside the Mt. Malindang Range Natural Park (MMRNP) and member of the Protected Area Management Board (PAMB). On January 19, 1971 Mt. Malindang was declared as a Na-



tional Park and Watershed Reservation by virtue of R.A. No. 6266. It became one of the initial components pursuant to NIPAS Act of 1992. It was delineated and formally established and proclaimed as Protected Area and its peripheral areas a Buffer Zone through Proclamation No. 228 on August 2, 2002. Due to the immense importance of Mt. Malindang, another step was undertaken for its protection and preservation by declaring it as a Natural Park on July 30, 2004 by virtue of R.A. No. 9304. Mt. Malindang Range Natural Park became the 29th member of the Asean Heritage Park in 2012 because of its rich biodiversity.

Since becoming a natural park, yearly celebration is conducted through different programs and activities highlighting the features of the mountain and its rich culture under the different themes. This year, the celebration bears the theme "PAGPANALIPOD SA BUKID MALINDANG, PAG-ALIM SA KINAIYAHAN, IPADAYON ALANG SA UMAABOT NG KALIWATAN." But because of the pandemic COVID-19 which requires strict observance of related protocols,

known as the "Wildlife Conservation and Protection Act". Last May 13, 2020, one female Green Sea Turtle (*Chelonia mydas*) was retrieved at the coastal waters in Barangay Bocator, Tangub City. Orlando Bitay, Ariel Barrientos, Fredo Fobadora and Danilo Baricatro, were the fishermen of the barangay who reported to the City ENRO that the said turtle was trapped inside the fishing net corral. The City ENRO responded and ensured the safety of the turtle in cooperation with the barangay officials. The turtle was identified as a Female Green Sea Turtle with a carapace width and length of 69 cm. and 74 cm., respectively. Upon coordination with the DENR-CENRO Ozamiz, tagging and documentation was undertaken after which the turtle was released at the seaport in Barangay Silanga, Tangub City witnessed by the City ENRO personnel; City Agriculture Office Staff (Mr. Egbert Surdilla and Mr. Brylle Compra); personnel from Philippine Coast Guard, PNP, KPART and Hon. Ginalyn Buntuan and company of Barangay Bocator. The turtle was applied with the left bronze tag having a record serial number PH 1784 L.

International Clean-up, Mangrove Tree Planting

September 19, 2020--Tangub City's Environment and Natural Resources Officer (CENRO) Dioscoro G. Tigol Jr. led the International Coastal Clean-up at Barangay Silanga. The same clean-up and Mangrove Tree Planting was conducted in the afternoon at Purok 4, 5, and 6 of Barangay San Apolinario. The Department of Environment and Natural Resources (DENR) representatives from CENRO Ozamiz, Philippine National Police, Philippine Coastguard, Barangay Officials, BPATs/CVOs, Purok Officials and residents participated in the activity.

There were marine debris observed in the coastal area of Silanga. Unsegregated garbage was dumped at the coastal area of San Apo. Tigol told the residents and officials of both barangays to strictly maintain the cleanliness of their area. Two hundred two (202) bakhaw seedlings were planted in San Apo.

Mary Grace Cabigas of CENRO Ozamiz said that the International Clean-up is conducted every 3rd Saturday of September. This activity was also conducted in Bonifacio, Ozamiz, and Tudela. "Naa poy International Bamboo Day mahitabo every year," she added.

OSAP's Cash Assistance to Fire Victims

Function Hall 1, Tangub City, September 16--Senator Bong Go's Office of the Special Assistant of the President (OSAP) representative Director Rodrigo Giducos and his team, gave assistance to the residents who are affected by fire.

Vicente Villapuz of Balatacan, Tangub City and Noel Abad Sintos of Sumasap, Panaon Misamis Occidental are the recipients of the assistance. The OSAP's partner agencies also gave what they could give to Villapuz and Sintos. Tangub City Mayor Jennifer W. Tan and Misamis Occidental Governor Philip T. Tan also extended assistance.

While President Duterte was still Mayor of Davao and Sen. Bong Go was his Executive Assistant, they already have this program, to give assistance to those who are affected by any form of disaster. As promised by Duterte and Go, what they did in Davao will be applied to the entire Philippines, Director Giducos said. As other partner agencies were not around during the giving of assistance. Giducos promised to call the other agencies regarding their own assistance to Villapuz and Sintos.

LEGISLATIVE CORNER

City Ordinance No. 2020-08-025 - AN ORDINANCE IMPLEMENTING THE ZERO OPEN DEFECATION (ZOD) IMPOSING FINES AND PENALTIES FOR VIOLATIONS AND PROVIDING FUNDS THEREOF

Objectives:

- a) To safeguard public health and well-being of all constituents; and
- b) To direct the involvement of all the barangays by enacting ordinance and designate a Barangay Sanitary Inspector to closely monitor the implementation of the ordinance.

Prohibited Acts:

- 1. Open defecation in open places such as outdoor spaces, playground, public squares or plazas, school grounds, church grounds and the like;
- 2. Throwing/leaving or depositing fecal waste in open places exposed to the environment; and
- 3. Any household who has no toilet facility or shared toilet facility.

Fines and Penalties

- 1. First Offense –Fine of P1, 000.00 or one (1) day community service to be rendered to the barangay where the violation occurred.
- 2. Second Offense – Fine of P2, 000.00 or two (2) days community service to be rendered to the barangay where the violation occurred.
- 3. Third Offense – Fine of P3, 000.00 or three (3) days community service to be rendered to the barangay where the violation occurred.
- 4. Barangays and respective concerned officials failing to enact and/or implement the same ordinance in their respective barangays will be subjected to administrative sanctions as provided by law or ordinance.

CITY ORDINANCE NO. 2020-08-023 – AN ORDINANCE IMPOSING FEE FOR SPECIAL GARBAGE COLLECTION TO INDIVIDUALS AND ALL TYPES OF ESTABLISHMENTS IN TANGUB CITY

Declaration of Policy. Maintenance of cleanliness of the environment promotes public health and safety and live ability of the place. To this effect the city government imposes garbage collection fees for the collection, transportation and disposal of garbage on individual households and establishments. However, it is observed that branches and leaves of trees pruned in residential areas which are dumped in roads, sidewalks and canals cannot be accommodated by the materials recovery facilities. Collecting these needs special trip, hence incurs additional cost from the government.

Fees:

Biodegradable Waste - P400.00 for 1 cu. m load. In excess of 1.cu. m, an additional of P100.00/cu. m + cost of fuel per kilo meter based on prevailing price

Non-Biodegradable Waste – P600.00 for 1 cu. m. an additional of P200.00/cu. m + cost of fuel per kilo meter based on prevailing price

Prohibitions, Fines and Penalties

- 1. Any individual and establishment operators or personnel are prohibited to dump any waste matters in public places such as roads, sidewalks, canals or cause or permit the same. Any violator shall be imposed a fine of P1, 000.00/ cu m of wastes and below and additional of P500.00 per cubic meter in every excess of 1 cu. m. but not to exceed P5, 000.00
- 2. Transporting and dumping wastes in bulk in the MRF without prior approval from the concerned barangay or office of the City.
- 3. The violator shall be imposed a fine of P1,000.00 for the first cubic meter and below of wastes and additional of P500.00 per cubic meter in every excess of 1 cu. m but not to exceed P5,000.00 or an imprisonment of number of days equivalent to one (1) day per cubic meter of wastes.
- 4. Any other violations related to solid waste management being committed by any person or establishments shall be imposed with fines and penalties as provided in the City Ordinance NO 2014-09-0019.

Joint Public Hearing with the Stakeholders

Tangub City, July 9, 2020--

The Committee Chair on Market and Taxation Hon. Eva R. Ordeniza, on Health Hon. Jose L. Pantoja, Jr., and on City Planning Hon. Filoteo C. Alngohuro presented their proposed ordinances during the joint public hearing on July 9, 2020 at the Sinanduloy Gym. The gathering was participated in by the concerned departments, agencies and stakeholders.

Hon. Ordeniza, presented the proposed amendments for secretary fees, police clearance fees, dog vaccination fee, and the revised tax revenue code of Tangub City.

Fifty pesos (P50.00) is charged for official documents. The same amount is true for Phil. Health Certification, digital copy of documented pictures (regardless of the number) per transaction.

Police clearance for employment, scholarship, study grant, and other purposes is One Hundred pesos (P100.00). First time jobseekers as stated in the Republic Act 11262 upon presentation of a barangay certification indicating that s/he is a first time job seeker, is free of charge.

Dog Vaccination is free. The fee for other certification of clearances such as tax clearance, certification of land holdings, time copy of tax declaration and other certification of clearances is One Hundred pesos (P100.00).



Hon. Jose L. Pantoja, Jr., committee chair on Health, presented the "Ordinance Implementing the Zero Open Defecation (ZOD) Imposing Fines and Penalties for Violators and Providing Funds Thereof."

The purpose of this ordinance is to promote zero open defecation to safeguard public health and well-being of all the constituents and allocating funds annually for sustainable sanitation programs.

The Sanitary Inspection Team reported that out of 55 barangays, there are nine (9) Zero Open Defecation barangays.

Hon. Filoteo C. Alngohuro presented the Ordinance Imposing Fee for Special Garbage Collection to Individuals and all types of establishments in Tangub City.

The Ordinance prohibits individuals, establishment operators or personnel from dumping any wastes in roads, sidewalks, canals, and dumping of wastes in bulk at materials recovery

facilities MRF without prior approval from the concerned barangay or office of the city. All barangays, including schools at different level whether private or public, have to put up their Material Recovery Facilities (MRF) to receive the segregated waste generated from the different sources in the barangay.

The special garbage collection refers to the collection of a particular type of wastes done in special trip and not during the regular schedule of garbage collections. However, local offices, public education and health institutions are exempted from payment of special garbage collection and other institutions subject to the approval of the city chief executive.

Alngohuro also presented the last ordinance that regulates the cutting/pruning of trees in public and private places.

Pruning permit is issued by the City Mayor or the authorized office. Pruning is permitted only in conditions that affect safety of life and property, enhancement of the aesthetic in surroundings and for other valid reasons. Only trees located in private lands, and city-owned lands shall be issued by the city with cutting permit, except those trees classified as premium species by the DENR and not posing danger or hazard to life and property to persons or to the general public. No trees shall be cut unless there replacement of seedlings.

Mis. Occ. Opens Project Haven

Talairon, Oroquieta City, July 28--Misamis Occidental opened the Provincial Isolation Facility named Project Haven. This facility is intended only



for those who are swab test positive.

Gov. Philip T. Tan thanked President Rodrigo Roa Duterte, Senator Bong Go, and Provincial Officials for making this great project possible.

The Governor clarified that the mayors should only quarantine those who are tested negative. The prov-

ince will take care and isolate those who are positive of swab test. He revealed that there are thirty-two (32) units of container facility. Twenty-two (22) units have two bedrooms and ten (10) units have one bedroom. Each room contains cable television, air conditioning unit, exhaust fan, private bathroom, water dispenser, travel pillow, linen and blanket, essential kits, mug, spoon and fork, table and chair, waste basket, clothes hanger, laundry basket, and free Wi-Fi.

This facility has twenty-four-hour staff on duty for fifteen days. After fifteen days, they will check out and another group takes over.

The 3-hectare area, where the facility is set-up, is supposedly for the construction of the new Misamis Occidental Provincial Hospital (MOPH). However, in this pandemic time, the need for a quarantine facility is the priority. The Provincial Government decided to temporarily build Project Haven in the area; this facility is easy to transfer since it is only made of container van.

Blessed by Archbishop Martin Sarmiento Jomud, this isolation facility is called Project Haven for this is where

the patients tested positive find themselves comfortable, safe and secure.

"This facility is a symbol of unity and service par excellence," Tan said.



Gov. Tan Places Misamis Occidental Under MGCQ

Pursuant to the Inter-Agency Task Force (IATF) Resolution No. 40, Gov. Philip T. Tan signed Executive Order No. 55 on May 31, 2020. If adopt the IATF guidelines to implement Modified General Community Quarantine (MGCQ) in the province of Misamis Occidental starting June 1, 2020 until June 15, 2020.

The order contained the modifications of stay-at-home policy, provincial quarantine passes, mandatory observance of the minimum public health standards, airport and seaport operations, liquor ban, retail selling and smoking ban, flexible work schedule, resumptions of business operations and activities, schools and colleges, mass gatherings and religious activities, land transportation, indoor and outdoor noncontact sports, checkpoints and border controls, returning residents, festivals and other related events, curfew hours, and wakes and funerals on May 31, 2020.

As set forth in the order, Misamisnons are allowed to go outside of their residences under the policies adopted by the concerned LGUs. Those who manifest influenza-like symptoms, cough, runny-nose, and fever, persons with co-morbidities and/or underlying conditions, senior citizens, and children are strongly advised to stay at home.

They will no longer use provincial quarantine passes. However, those non-residents and non-Authorized Persons Outside Residence (APORs) who wish to come into the territorial jurisdiction of Misamis Occidental are required to check-in at the border control facilities and secure provincial quarantine border passes.

The minimum public health standards become the "New Normal" in the province to be enforced in all workplaces, establishments, shops, stores, terminals, airport, seaport, and offices whether public or private.

Aviation and maritime public transportations are allowed to operate following the guidelines issued by DOTr. Public health standard shall be observed. Prohibition on the selling of liquor and other alcoholic products is lifted. However, consumption of

alcohol is strictly prohibited in any public place. More so, the retail

selling of cigarettes, tobacco and smoking in public places is prohibited pursu-



ant to Executive Order No. 26, Series of 2017.

Both public and private work establishments are encouraged to adopt flexible work schedule.

The permitted business establishments and activities on categories I-IV (per DTI issuances) are allowed to operate full operational capacity. However, barbershops and tailors are permitted to operate at a maximum of fifty percent (50%) venue capacity. Restaurants, fast food and retail establishments are allowed to offer dine-in at a maximum of fifty percent (50%) seating capacity.

Face to face classes are still suspended in accordance with the existing rules, guidelines and regulations.

Mass gatherings are allowed but the participants should only be limited to fifty percent (50%) of the seating capacity. Religious gatherings are also allowed provided that churchgoers are limited to 50% of the seating capacity of the church, mosque or synagogue.

Governed by the Department of Transportation (DOTr) and Land Transportation Office (LTO) guidelines and policies, the movement of public and private vehicles shall be allowed.

Forms of exercises such as but not limited to walking, jogging, running,

biking, golf, swimming, tennis, badminton, Zumba and skate boarding are allowed provided that the minimum public health standard are observed.

The checkpoints and border control facilities function as security checkpoints subject to the guidelines and regulations imposed by the Department of Interior Local Government (DILG) and Philippine National Police (PNP).

The repatriation of the Locally Stranded Individuals (LSIs) and Overseas Filipino Workers (OFWs) and all other returning Misamisnons is governed by pertinent IATF issuances.

Festivals, related events likes fiestas, and LGU anniversaries are still suspended.

The Cities and Municipalities are hereby mandated to harmonize the curfew hours. Exempted are those government officials and employees, Authorized Persons Outside Residence (APORs), front liners, and persons in transit to seaports and airport.

Wakes and funerals are allowed. However, minimum public health standards should be strictly observed.

To keep Tangub City safe from the emerging illness, Mayor Jennifer W. Tan signed the 6th addendum to the Executive Order No. 038 to create and establish the COVID-19 City Task Force, and enact emergency measures to prevent and/or contain the spread of COVID-19.

As stated in the order are: Modified Community Quarantine, COVID-19 Protection Stations, Modifications of Barangay Passes, resumption of Business Operations and Activities, Mass gatherings and Religious Activities, Indoor and Outdoor Exercises, Continuation of Protective Measures, and Schools and Colleges,

The Inter-Agency Task Force for the Management of Emerging Infectious Diseases (IATF MEID) classified Misamis Occidental as low-risk province to be placed under Modified General Community Quarantine (MGCQ). The classification is based on epidemic risk level, economic, social, and security considerations, and the appeals and commitment of local government units in accordance with the recommendations of the IATF Screening and Validation Committee.

GADTC Distributes TES

Tangub City, July 1, 2020--- Distribution of Tertiary Education Subsidy (TES) grants to qualified students at the Activity Center facilitated by GADTC through the Vice President for Administration Bellaflor E. Fernandez, Head of Student Affairs Engr. Erwin Lacpao, Scholarship head Jennifer T. Tia, Security personnel head John Almazan and Tangub City disbursing



officers. The grantees received cash of forty thousand pesos (P40, 000.00)

each for one-year or a two-semester subsidy.

Mayor Jennifer W. Tan met the students and informed them, especially those who are non-residents, to stay within the city or province for the whole semester once classes start. This is to diminish cross contamination and make the community safe.

PCOO Sec. Andanar interviewed Mayor Tan and SK Yonting Mayor Tan Reorients KPART

(PCOO) Sec. Jesus Martin Andanar interviewed Tangub City Mayor Jennifer W. Tan in his online live radio program over Radio Pilipinas, and all other digital platforms of the PCOO. This pertains to COVID cases in Tangub and the City's Initiatives and plans for the New Normal Education. In the same forum, the secretary also interviewed Sangguniang Kabataan Federated Presedent Philip Jon Axel G. Yonting on SK Federation Projects.

The Mayor revealed that the five (5) COVID positive patients were at the Provincial facility. Mayor Tan also revealed that the city-owned Governor Alfonso D. Tan College (GADTC) Administration already talked with some of the internet providers for the convergence site at the barangay halls as students' study area. More so, GADTC already negotiated for the provision of free tablet for both students and faculty. Since there was no budget from the national government yet, GADTC sourced out their funds.



But the fund is still insufficient, the students will add One Thousand Pesos (1,000.00) when they enroll.

GADTC submitted a request to Regional Development Council for CHED to include the internet subscription fee for distance learning.

As agreed between Tangub City COVID-19 Task Force and the Provincial Government of Misamis Occidental, students who live outside Misamis Occidental will undergo rapid testing. As agreed also by the presidents, teachers and boarding house owners that they should stay within the jurisdiction of Tangub or even in Misamis Occidental within the semester or even the next semester. This is to avoid cross contamination and to make the community safe.

On the other hand, Philip Yonting shared Tangub City's Sangguniang Kabataan contribution in facilitating the repatriation of the Locally Stranded Individuals (LSIs) and Repatriated Overseas Filipinos (ROFs).

Mayor Jennifer W. Tan, the Committee chair on Peace and Order Hon. Gerry Anggot, HRMO/Administrator Wilmar O. Cuambot, City Legal Officer Atty. Brendale Bayalas, and City Health Officer Dr. Janice C. Biete met the Tangub City's Keeper for Peace and Accident Rescue Team (KPART) headed by Chief Roel Deriada to discuss the roles of KPART in this pandemic time, New Normal Protocols including Lecture and status updates on COVI-19 at Function Hall 1 on July 1, 2020 were talked.

Mayor Tan reminded the KPARTs to strictly observe the policies enforced by the city government and to implement them with due process. In this pandemic time, they need to study the ordinances to strengthen their role in the city as partners of the police force. She challenged them saying, "Siguradua nga sa inyung pagsulod sa KPART, kinasingkasing. Committed jud mo. Dako kug respeto ninyo ug sa mga pulis. Mosaludar mi ninyo." She further assured them that she's just a text/call a way whenever they encounter problems that need clarification.

Atty. Brendale Bayalas discussed the aspect of due process, the process of approaching policy violators, issuance of citation tickets, and Miranda Rights.

Atty. Bayalas said "As law enforcement unit, pwede mo makadakop ug tawo following the due process." There will be more sessions in the following months to strengthen their knowledge on their duties and obligations. Mr. Wilmar Cuambot reminded the KPARTs their basic duties, responsibilities, segregation and implementation of ordinances.

On the other hand, Dr. Biete discussed the New Normal, lectured and updated them on COVID-19. To control the transmission, proper cough etiquette and wearing of face masks should be observed at all times as self-precautionary measures. As regards the quarantine facility, Dr. Biete reminded the KPART who are on duty to prohibit visitors and relatives from seeing the LSIs or ROFs.

Guillen, Bayalas present the Omnibus Guidelines

Tangub City, July 30-- Department of the Interior and Local Government (DILG) City Director Richard Jasper Guillen and City Legal Officer Atty. Brendale Bayalas presented the localized Omnibus Guidelines during the coordination meeting with the COVID-19 City Task Force.

Stipulated in the guidelines are the procedure in acquiring Travel Authority for the incoming and outgoing ROFs and LSIs, Rules on Quarantine Facility Occupancy, and Proper Conduct of ROFs and LSIs during Quarantine, Standard Precautions, Duties and Functions of the barangay, Protocol for private vehicles fetching LSIs and ROFs, Minimum Public Health Standards, Reporting Mechanism, and penalties for violating the protocols were also intended.

Guillen mentioned the step by step process in acquiring travel authority. The

preservation of all objects within the quarantine facility. Drinking alcoholic beverages, smoking, and gambling are prohibited.

The barangay captain, officer of the day, BHW, Purok Service Unit (PSU) Tanod officer of the day, Sangguniang Kabataan Chairman and SK Council, Midwife (optional) shall be present during the turnover of the ROFs and LSIs.

All drivers and accompanying persons are obliged to go to the Balay Silangan Quarantine area for distribution of PPEs and instruction. On the other hand, all persons and establishments in Tangub shall strictly comply with the following minimum health standards as stated in the Department of Health (DOH) Administrative Order No. 2020-0015.

The barangay affairs shall also conduct daily status



Locally Stranded Individuals (LSIs) and Repatriated Overseas Filipinos (ROFs) shall sign the terms and agreement upon isolation in a quarantine facility and disinfect their areas or room assignment every eight in the morning until nine o'clock in the morning. The barangay will provide cleaning tools and disinfectants. More so, the designated Barangay Health Workers (BHWs) will examine the room or area for compliance. No visitors, relatives or caretakers are allowed to enter the quarantine facility.

The LSIs and ROFs shall confine themselves to the area assigned to them for fourteen (14) consecutive days. They should be responsible for the

updates on COVID-19 and submit them to the DILG office, and furnish copies thereof to the City Health Office and City Tourism Office.

The DEP-Ed schools of Tangub are utilized as Ligas Covid Centers for the returning LSIs and ROFs. Atty. Bayalas asked DEP-Ed to understand the situation of the city because the end of utilizing the classrooms cannot be predicted.

Agustines Cepe said that he will make a memorandum to continue accepting ROFs and LSIs in the schools. He also said that the teachers will automatically work from home if the rooms will be utilized for the ROFs and LSIs.

Make Way for Pan de Hoyohoy

Maribel Codes is a trustee of the family's formula that spans three generations. Pan de Hoyohoy was first formulated by her grandmother when they still lived in San Carlos City, Negros Occidental. In 1990, the family moved to Tangub City, and settled in Hoyohoy, or what is now Barangay Fertig Hills.

Maribel grew up observing her mother bake bread in the home-made tin oven. She would sell the bread around the neighbourhood. In no time, the "secret formula" was passed on to her as she got married and have her own family.

The bread slowly gained reputation in the barangay. On ordinary days, she could use up seven (7) kilos of flour which yields two hundred pieces of bread. These are sold out in just three hours in the barangay. Although there are some who also sell home-baked bread, neighbours would wait for Maribel's especially in the morning as a must-pair for coffee. These days, she only bakes on Mondays and Fridays because she and her husband work in their vegetable garden.

Maribel would serve the bread when they have meetings in the barangay (she used to be a barangay councilor). Because of its distinct taste and texture the bread caught the attention of Mayor Jenny. She introduced the bread to Dr. Herbert Glenn Reyes, president of Northwestern Mindanao State College of Science and Technology (NMSCST) as part of the school's extension and community involvement program. A Memorandum of Agreement was signed on July 6, 2020 between NMSCST, Tangub City LGU and Barangay Fertig Hills to promote Pan de Hoyohoy.

The Memorandum of Agreement opens wide opportunities for Pan de Hoyohoy. The College will connect with the Dept. of Trade and Industry to improve its packaging and promotion. A cooperative will be organized in Barangay Fertig Hills. The bread will be displayed at Belvedere Coffee Shoppe which is managed by NMSCST, with flyers and brochures that tell the story of the bread. Pan de Hoyohoy will have its display area at the Public Market and Courtyard during "tabo" day. DXCT Radyo Pilipinas will promote it on air.

As the bread is baked on tin oven, a modified cooking equipment will be purchased for fast production. "We will upgrade the bread not necessarily using metal. *Lahi ang metal kaysa naandan nga taro,*" Mayor Jenny Tan said.

All these efforts are geared towards making Pan de Hoyohoy the pride of Fertig Hills with the city government's support to a home-grown baking industry. Maribel's "secret" for three generations is now brought to the open. It will benefit her family, her barangay and the City of Tangub in general. So, why won't we make way for Pan de Hoyohoy?
