## Gov. Philip Tan Issued EO No. 40



## CITY ON ALERT

**T**angub City Mayor Jennifer W. Tan signed Executive Order No. 038 series of 2020, on March 14, 2020 "AN ORDER CREATING AND ESTABLISHING COVID-19 CITY TASK FORCE OF TANGUB CITY, AND ENACTING EMERGENCY MEASURES TO PREVENT AND/OR CONTAIN THE SPREAD OF COVID-19 TO THE CITY" due to the alarming rate of COVID-19 pandemic cases reported at various places in the country.

The Department of Interior and Local Government (DILG) ordered the local government units to activate their Local COVID-19 Task Forces (LCTF) to spearhead the monitoring and implementation of control measures to prevent the spread of infectious disease including the deadly coronavirus disease (COVID-19) (Section 1). In response, the local government right away put up COVID-19 PROTECTION STATIONS at the entry and exit points: Sta. Maria highway boundary, Sumirap highway boundary, the Y-junction connecting Belvedere and Gala, Ozamiz City, and Silanga port. The frontliners who man these protection stations are composite personnel of the City Health Office, Philippine National Police, Keepers for Peace and Rescue Team (KPART), City Disaster Risk Reduction Management Office (CDRRMO).

**M**isamis Occidental Gov. Philip T. Tan issued Executive Order No. 40, on March 12, 2020, "AN ORDER IMPLEMENTING PRESIDENTIAL PROCLAMATION NO. 922 DATED MARCH 8, 2020 AS WELL AS



REITERATING THE PROHIBITIONS AND PROTOCOLS IN DEALING WITH COVID-19" to curtail and eliminate the COVID-19 pandemic threat.

The order stipulated that all public and private employees are mandated to follow health and safety protocols. Public transportation, establishments and other places where people frequently gather should conduct daily infection protocols of frequently touched surfaces. Mass gatherings are postponed until further notice.

LGUs are directed to extend manpower and financial resources to the Department of Health and/or to the local health personnel implementing this order, and may use its emergency funds to defray the procurement of the needed supplies, medicines and equipment in order to take response and measures to curtail and eliminate the COVID-19 threat. Any medical officer may ask assistance from AFP and/or PNP.

Barangay Health Emergency Response Teams (BHERTs) are to report new arrivals of those who travelled outside the country and the province of Misamis Occidental and gather information of their travel history.

A person who manifested the COVID-19 symptoms shall follow protocols. Hospitals are to organize and train COVID-19 response team, prepare an isolation room, and provide sufficient PPE's.

Gov. Tan reminded all officials and employees, in private and public institutions, local or national government, to strictly observe and implement this order for the protection and promotion of public health and safety.

Pursuant to this, the Gov. also issued Executive no. 42 on March 16, 2020 placing the entire province under General Community Quarantine.

## Free Face Masks

April 3, 2020---Tangub City Women Association (TACEFIWA) donated 114 face masks to the City Social Welfare and Development Office for its beneficiaries as protective gear against COVID-19.




## From the MAYOR'S DESK

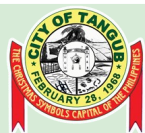

The City ENR/SWM office on COVID-19 Time

With the existing crisis on COVID-19 that poses horrible threats to human life, it is anticipated that household wastes may have been contaminated with the coronavirus from undetermined sources. Although there were reported cases of persons positive in rapid test but turned out negative during the confirmatory test, the City took some precautions to prevent possible transmission of virus from the wastes generated by the suspected or under quarantined persons. The city enforced the following enhancement of solid waste management scheme/program:

1. All sources of wastes (households & establishments) shall perform the mandatory proper solid waste segregation. Covid-19 Monitoring stations/ check points, isolation and holding areas are required to have its own separate containers with cover for the used/waste protective gears and other paraphernalia which are considered as special wastes. Close coordination of the city health office/COVID-19 coordinator of the city was being done.



2. All garbage personnel (collectors and sorters) were issued with hand gloves, mouth masks, alcohol, hand wash soap, rubber boots and plastic water container with faucet to clean –up and sanitize their hands every after work or before they eat their food.

3. Stainless knapsack sprayer and disinfectant liquid shall be provided to disinfect the solid waste before loading to the garbage truck and before final sorting at the city’s Central Material Recovery Facility (CMRF).

4. All Covid-19 related waste, after being disinfected shall be separately loaded to avoid comingling with other wastes, and covered with nets during transportation to prevent flying off of plastics and others to the air.

5. All barangay MRFs are closely monitored to ensure compliance to the program in coordination with the barangay chairperson or his/her SWM focal person.

6. Open burning, including slash and burn (“kaingin”) farming approach is strictly regulated pursuant to the Memorandum issued by the City Mayor, Hon. Jennifer W. Tan, to all 55 barangay chairmen, all local and national government offices, all concerned establishments and institutions within the jurisdiction of the City.

In addition to the enhanced solid waste management scheme, and in compliance to the call of the Environmental Management Bureau of the Department of Environment and Natural resources (EMB-DENR) to enhance wastewater management to combat Covid-19, the city requires all Wastewater Treatment Plants and Facilities in the city to install an adequate disinfection at the last stage of the

treatment process prior to discharge to any water body. The City also requires all establishments with personnel assigned in pollution control sanitation, medical/hospital/health-care waste management facilities with the proper and adequate Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) as prescribed by the Department of Health (DOH) and /or other authorized agencies.

As to the Urban Gardening Program of the City spearheaded by the City Agriculture office, the city ENR/SWM office produces plant pots out of waste plastic bottles from its collected garbage and ready to use by those who want to plant but no pots to be used. This is a diversion strategy of the recyclable wastes generated from different sources in the city.

## Food Packs Distribution



The Local Government of Tangub distributed food packs to the city constituents as a measure to contain the effects of COVID 19. The first round was composed of the first wave and the second wave. The sikad, habal-habal and sidecar drivers were the beneficiaries. The food packs contained 10 kilos of rice for those with five (5) family members and below, and 25 kilos for those with six (6) family members and above. Aside from rice, the pack contained ten pieces of tinapa, ten pieces of noodles, 1 kilo of dried fish, and 1/4 kilo of salt. The distribution started on March 24, 2020.

The second wave under the first round distribution was intended for all households, regardless of political color, social and economic status in life. The food packs contained 15 kilos rice, for those with less than six members and 25 kilos for those with more than six members. With rice came 1/2 kilos each of mongo and bihon, 6 pieces tinapa, and 1 kilo dried fish. The second round was again distributed to all households. The same quantity and types of goods went into the packs.

## Food Handling and COVID-19 Campaign

Tangub City officials, together with the Tourism Council conducted the "Food Handling and COVID-19 Information Campaign" on March 10, 2020 at Gov. Alfonso D. Tan College Conference Room. This was initiated by City Mayor Jennifer Wee. Tan. It was well attended by the food handlers and the barangay committee on sanitation and health in Tangub City. This campaign, through informative presentation and discussion of the speakers, raised awareness on Food Handling and Safety Procedures to prevent the proliferation of illnesses and viruses. Most importantly, the presentation provided insight, understanding and information on COVID-19.

Ms. Sonny Lyn. S. Alave, an advocate for healthy eating, shared her knowledge about Food Handling and Safety Procedures. She presented that there are four safety procedures to avoid food contamination and poisoning: Identify hazard and risks, follow enterprise hygiene, standards, procedures and practices, handle and store food stuffs and follow safety program.

Dr. Janice Biete, the City Health Officer, gave updates on the status of COVID-19. She relayed the Global report, Philippine report, and Misamis Occidental report of the number of reported confirmed covid-19 cases as of March 10, 2020. She also shared the Self Protection Measures. Most importantly, to avoid fake news, the advisory of the DOH is to remember the "NCOV" before you share.

On the other hand, Ms. Yeni Ann Isabella W. Tan also spoke in statistics and data about COVID-19, how deadly the virus is, how it spreads and the symptoms and



implications of C orona Virus in the person's body. She also encouraged everyone to practice personal hygiene, the simple and most effective way to prevent such virus.

Mayor Jennifer W. Tan encouraged everyone especially the food handlers to boost the campaign in maintaining proper hygiene by following the procedures and measures discussed. To add, the city council, headed by Vice Mayor Alberto Penas, committed to conduct a quarterly inspection on every business establishment. Each establishment is provided with a "health board" that contains stars. A star is an indicator that the store has passed the health inspection. This is connected to the provision known as the "Food Safety Act of 2013" A JOINT DA-DOH ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER WHICH IS TO PROTECT CONSUMER HEALTH AND FACILITATE MARKET ACCESS OF LOCAL FOODS AND FOOD PRODUCTS.

DILG Director, Richard Jasper Guillen and Incident Post Commander, Gerry Anggot informed everybody on the process of cash aid distribution. Mayor Tan gave an inspiring message to everybody. Protocols were discussed and everyone was encouraged to follow them at all times. GADTC family volunteers were acknowledged for assisting the beneficiaries in filling out the SAC form.

## SAP Cash Aid for Beneficiaries



Tangub CSWD, headed by Mrs. Virgilita A. Delos Santos, government employees and volunteers, distributed SAP cash aid to beneficiaries at cluster barangays from April 27 to May 10, 2020. Tangub LGU provided police escort for safety and security of distribution. Based on the data given by Mrs. Delos Santos, there are 7, 142 beneficiaries who received the cash aid.

### City Ordinance 2020-03-008

**“An Ordinance on the Collection of Corresponding Barangay Clearance Fee in the Application for Any Business Related Transaction”**  
Author: Hon. Eva R. Ordeniza  
Date Approved: March 31, 2020  
Coverage – Issuance of Barangay Clearance for Business Permit and Locational Clearance  
**Rationale:**  
Simplify the process of business registration  
Provide a more efficient and effective revenue collection  
Prompt and friendlier atmosphere for tax payers and investors  
**Process:** The City Government issues and collects barangay clearance payment for business permit and locational clearance, the collection of which will be remitted to the concerned barangay not later than seven (7) working days of the ensuing month.



## Lecture on COVID 19 And Vitamin C for Employees

March 16, 2020---City Mayor, Dr. Jennifer Wee-Tan ordered an information dissemination lecture on Novel Coronavirus (2019-nCoV) (COVID-19) by department through City Health Officer, Dr. Janice C. Biete at Aspiration Hall (SP Session Hall) Tangub City. The lecture was participated in by the employees of the City Mayor's Office. On March 13, 2020, the information dissemination was attended by the office of the City Council, City Planning and Budget office, Accounting office, Assessor's office, Local Civil Registrar and City Social Welfare and Development. Other offices also have their own schedule.



Through informative presentation, the lecture was conducted to provide updates on the status of the zoonotic virus---COVID-19 and to discuss proper hand washing and proper cough etiquette. She also discussed the steps in proper hand washing and proper cough etiquette. As of March 15, 2020, according to the Philippine Report, there were 140 confirmed cases and 11 death. At the end of the lecture, all the participants were given Vitamin C to strengthen their immune system in fighting the virus. Dr. Biete encouraged everyone to cooperate per order of the Local Chief Executive for the safety and security of the city folks.

## City Mayor visits Frontliners



March 18, 2020---Tangub City Mayor Dr. Jennifer Wee-Tan visited the COVID-19 PROTECTION STATIONS, the entry and exit points: Sta. **I**t is the State's Policy to protect and promote the right to health of the people (Section 15, Article II of the Philippine Constitution) and the President of the Republic of the Philippines shall declare a State of Public Health Emergency in the event of an epidemic of National and/or International concern which threatens national security in order to mobilize government and non -governmental agencies to respond to the threat (Section 7 of R.A. No.1132).

According to ANC News Report,"Philippine Health Secretary, Francisco Duque III, said the proclamation paves the way for easier procurement of medical supplies as well as powers for mandatory quarantine to contain the virus."

The State of Public Health Emergency shall remain in force and effect until lifted or withdrawn by the President (Section 5)

## Tangub City finalizing Citizen's Charter

**T**ANGUB CITY, Misamis Occidental, May 21 (PIA)—Twenty-four department heads, division and section heads have recently presented their respective frontline services for the city's Citizen's Charter before the city mayor, vice mayor and other city officials at Function Hall 1.

Some 209 frontline services were reviewed to be fine-tuned according to processing time, fees, procedures and actions of the divisions concerned.

City Mayor Jennifer Tan emphasized that these frontline services should be examined thoroughly as these become the clients' basis in availing of the local government's services.

Mayor Tan and the members of the Anti-Red Tape Unit (ARTU) chaired by City Development and Planning Officer Emerson Dablo with City Administrator Tessie Lomanta, City Legal Officer, Brendale Bayalas, Human Resource Management Officer Wilmar Cuambot and Dr. Maricelle Nueva, officer-in-charge of Gov. Alfonso Tan College critiqued the presentations.

The Citizen's Charter is a manual of frontline services of the local government to its clients. The Charter stipulates the various services of the government, the steps the clients do, the government action on the step, amount of time needed to complete the step, amount to be paid, if there is, and the person in charge. It is the official document that communicates in simple terms, service standards, pledge of an agency on the government services being provided to the citizens.

Other than communicating the service standards of the office, it also serves as the basis for establishing the government employees involved in unnecessary red tape and corruption.

In line with the Ease of Doing Business and Efficient Government Service Delivery Act of 2018, the President in his State of the Nation Address 2019 reiterated his directive to the government offices to fast-track the programs to streamline and improve government service delivery. # GADTC Adopts New Normal

Higher Education Institutions (HIEs) are in the process of modification. Their academic responsibilities and endeavors have changed brought about by the COVID-19 outbreak. To abide by the recommendations and policies of the Commission on Higher Education (CHED), HEIs modify the academic system, apply necessary guidelines, and avail of flexible learning options to continue to deliver quality education adopting the New Normal.



Gov. Alfonso D. Tan College (GADTC) Administration employs New Normal alternative plans to deliver quality education toward students amidst global socio-economic, cultural, and health crises. It determines strategies for students to comply with requirements for the subject or degree program. The school avails of flexible learning: online classes and online learning. Each institute has a Facebook page to reach out to their students, and teachers created group chat on their classes. The instructors download handouts, instructional materials, online videos, reading materials, and activities for students' access through the internet, however lenient to their students per CHED's instruction. Mrs. Juris Rita P. Seclot, Head, Corporate Communication, and Promotion said that this is the time to maximize the use of social media, especially Facebook and YouTube. "GADTC Administration does not follow mass promotion" she added.



To comply with the memorandum sent by CHED Region X, GADTC conducted a Learning Management System Development Survey to be filled out by students. It revealed that less than 10% of the students have no gadgets. Some students have devices, but with poor connections, the result of which serves as a basis to organize plans and guidelines for students.

Teachers conducted orientation on Teaching and Learning in the New Normal Classes, management committee meetings, Zoom Series: Kumustahan with the Students, and a series of webinars to discuss content enrichment, technology advancement, online learning styles, online classes, and 21st-century teachers. In support to the government of Tangub, GADTC Management did the following:

1.They gave food packs to stranded students, and helped process their papers so they could be brought back to their respective hometowns using the local government vehicles.

2.They gave food and snacks, facemasks, face shields to the front liners.

3.Twenty (20) faculty volunteered to man the hotline to answer calls for the Balik Miss. Occ. Program of Misamis Occidental.

4.Forty (40) volunteers assisted in the orientation of the beneficiaries in accomplishing the requirements for So-



cial Amelioration Card for SAP aid cash distribution.

GADTC has ended the semester A.Y. 2019-2020 to welcome New Normal A.Y. 2020-2021. CHED also advises HIEs to ensure the safety of the students once classes start.

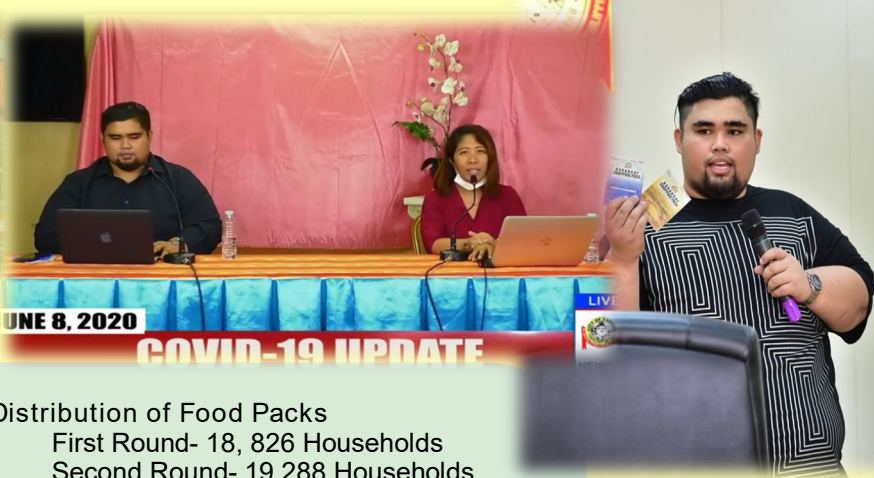
